What is Presbyterian Cursillo?

Cursillo (cur-see-yo) is a Spanish word that can be translated as "a short course." Presbyterian Cursillo is a three-day, lay-led spiritual renewal weekend that presents a short course in living life in Christ. Its purpose is to help Christians become more deeply rooted in their faith by focusing on God's unconditional love and Christ's call to service.

Presbyterian Cursillo weekends are open to members of any Presbyterian Church. Presbyterian Church (USA) clergy are on hand for spiritual guidance, prayer, and administering the sacraments. Every activity is grounded in reformed theology and is in accord with the PC (USA) Book of Order.



Who attends Presbyterian Cursillo?

Adults of all ages, in all phases of faith and discipleship. Christians who –

- ◆ Seek to live the life that God intends.
- ◆ Want to learn more, and grow in their faith.

Cursillo is not designed to change what you believe, but to help you realize the full abundance and grace of that belief. It is a time to focus fully on God. People find different things at Cursillo. For some, it's a renewed joy in being a Christian. For others, it may be a recommitment to a long forgotten promise. For most, it is a time of total worship – a time spent in a community of Christians, concentrating every effort toward praise and worship.

"Here I am, Lord. Is it I, Lord?"

You can expect to

- ◆ Form friendships that will last a lifetime.
- ◆ Enjoy inspirational music.
- ◆ Experience life away from the distractions of this busy world.
- ◆ Hear fellow Christians share how Jesus has impacted their lives.
- ◆ Focus totally on God and His endless grace, goodness and love.

There is much more to a Presbyterian Cursillo weekend, including some very special surprises.

People who attend a Presbyterian Cursillo weekend often take on more active roles in their church and community. Many also become more open to sharing the good news of Jesus Christ with others.
